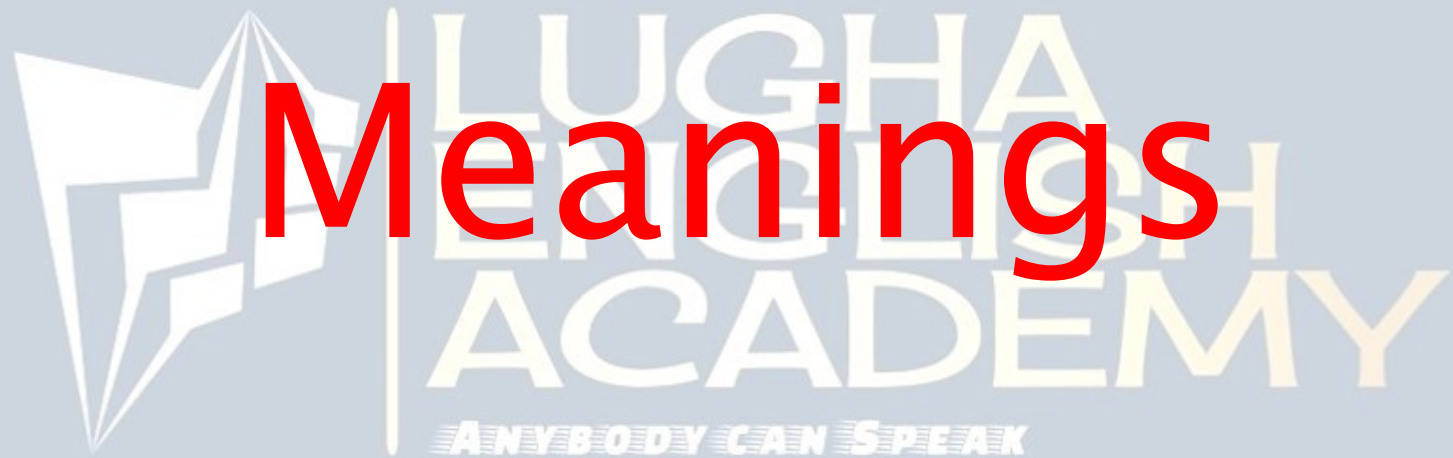

Jovial – a cheerful, merry and good-natured person.

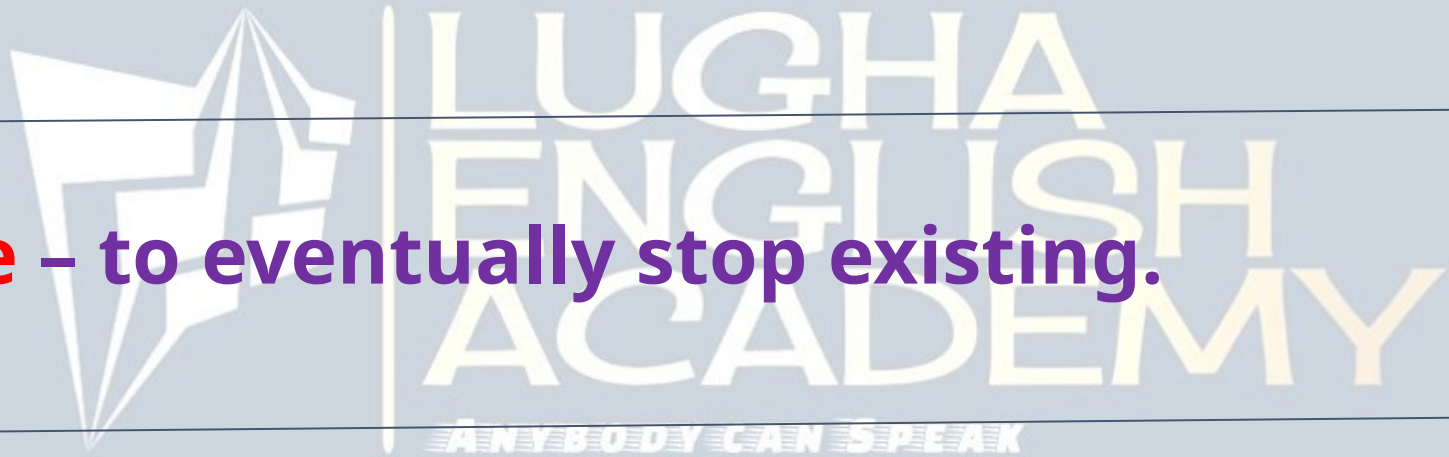
Feeble – a person or statement that is unconvincing and weak.

Edible – something suitable to be eaten.

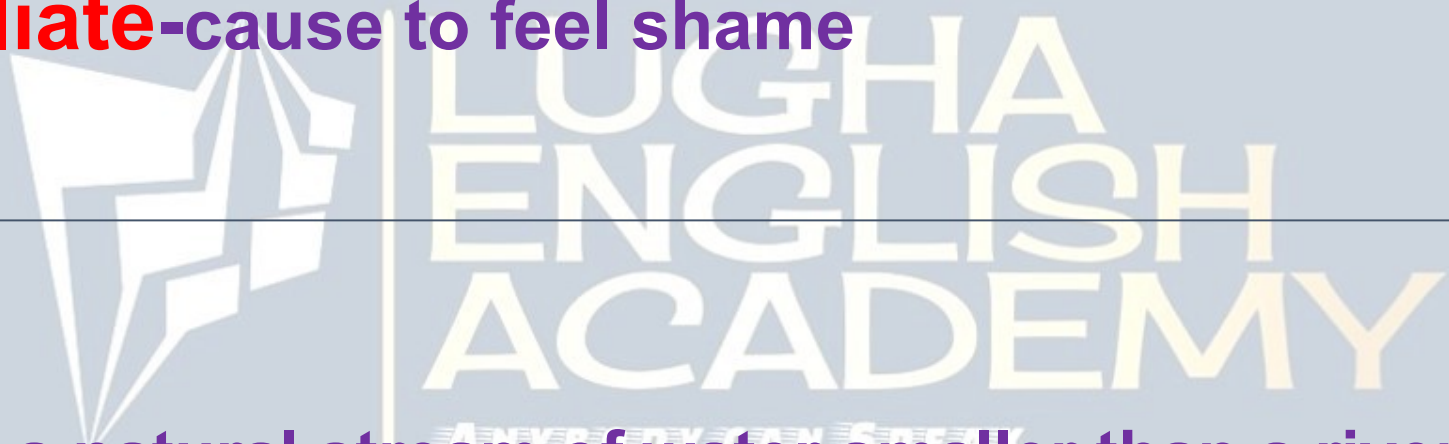
Cease – to eventually stop existing.
