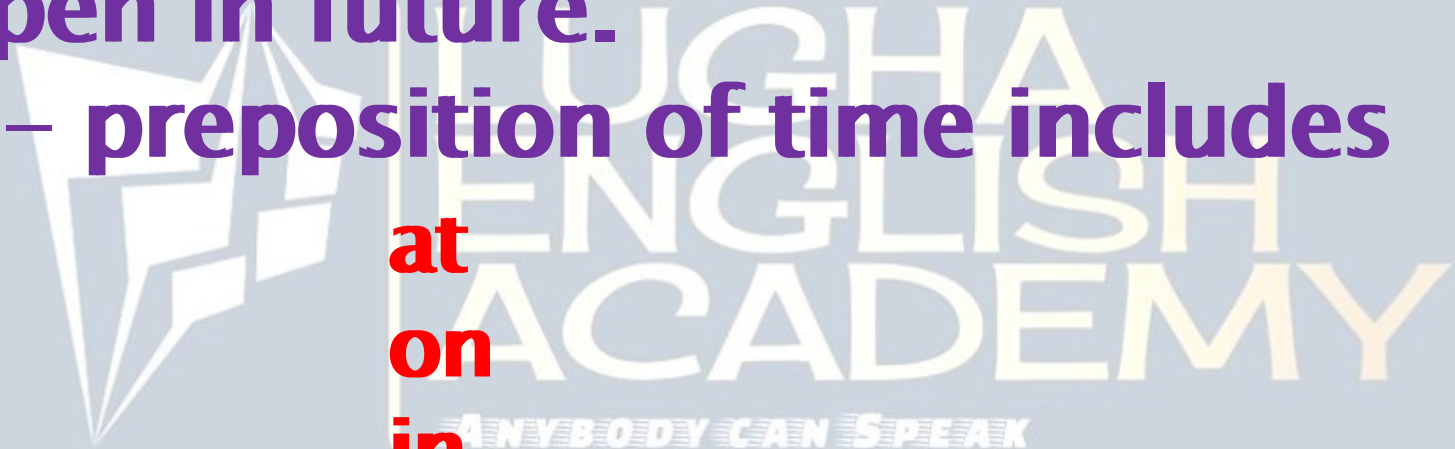

**in** – refers to years, months, seasons, centuries and time of day.

Ex: It is always hot **in** May

**on** – refers to days, dates and specific holidays. (holidays ends with day)

Ex: We go to church **on** Sunday.

# Preposition of time

**at** – refers to specific time and festivals.(holidays that don't end with day)

Ex: Priya will attend the class **at** 12 p.m.

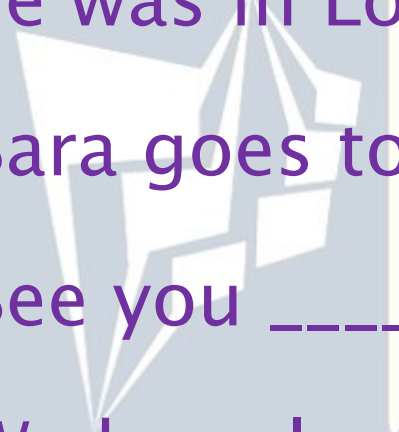
