



Simple Tenses: Present, Past, and Future

ANYBODY CAN SPEAK

The **tense** of a **verb** shows **when** something happens.



present tense
↓
I **run** every day.

past tense
↓
~~ANYBODY CAN SPEAK~~
I **ran** yesterday.

future tense
↓
I **will run** tomorrow.

The **simple tense verbs** simply indicate actions in **present, past, and future**.

The **simple present tense** is used to indicate the following:

- 
- **habits**
 - **regular events**
 - **current situations**
 - **general truths or facts**

Simple present tense

It resembles the **base form** of a verb, but we add **-s**, or **-es**, or **-ies** when the subject is in the third person (he / she / it).

Rule- Subject + verb/verb+s(v1)

I, you, we, they He, she, it, name

reads

cook

cooks

walk

walks

Subject	Singular	Plural
First person	I <i>ANYBODY CAN SPEAK</i>	We
Second person	You	You
Third person	He, She, It, Name (ex: Sam)	They

For each sentence of any tense has a basic formula.

a) Sentences – simple present

Subject	+ verb (action words)	+ object (receives action)
I, You, We, They	Singular Ex : play	football
He, She, It, Sam (Name)	Plural Ex : plays	football

Example:

- i) I **play** football.
- ii) You **play** football.
- iii) We **play** football.
- iv) They **play** football.
- v) He **plays** football.
- vi) She **plays** football.
- vii) It **plays** football.
- viii) Sam **plays** football.

b) Negative sentences – simple present

Subject	+ verb	+ object
I, You, We, They	(do not / don't) Ex : go	to school
He, She, It, Sam (Name)	(does not / doesn't) Ex : go	to school

Example :

i) I go to school.	i) I do not go to school.
ii) You go to school.	ii) You do not go to school.
iii) We go to school.	iii) We do not go to school.
iv) They go to school.	iv) They do not go to school.
v) He goes to school.	v) He does not go to school.
vi) She goes to school.	vi) She does not go to school.
vii) It goes to school.	vii) It does not go to school.
viii) Sam goes to school.	viii) Sam does not go to school.

c) Questions – simple present

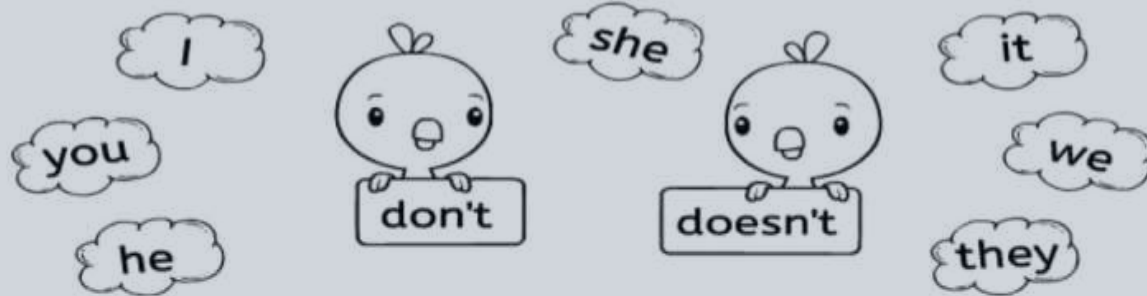
Subject	+ verb	+ object
I, You, We, They	(do) Ex: sing	song
He, She, It, Sam (Name)	(does) Ex : sing	Song

Example :

i) I sing a song.	i) Do I sing a song?
ii) You sing a song.	ii) Do you sing a song?
iii) We sing a song.	iii) Do we sing a song?
iv) They sing a song.	iv) Do they sing a song?
v) He sings a song.	v) Does he sing a song?
vi) She sings a song.	vi) Does she sing a song?
vii) It sings a song.	vii) Does it sing a song?
viii) Sam sings a song.	viii) Does Sam sing a song?

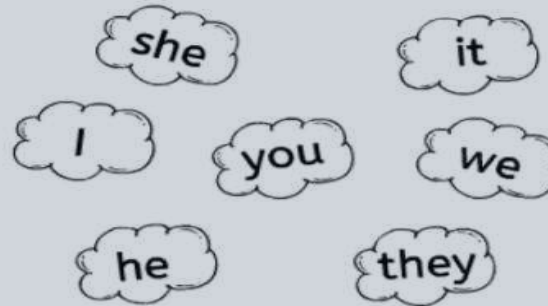
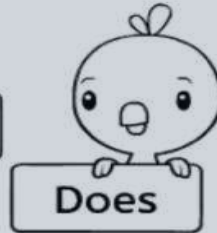
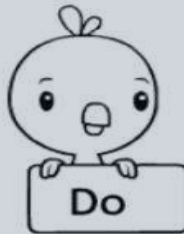
