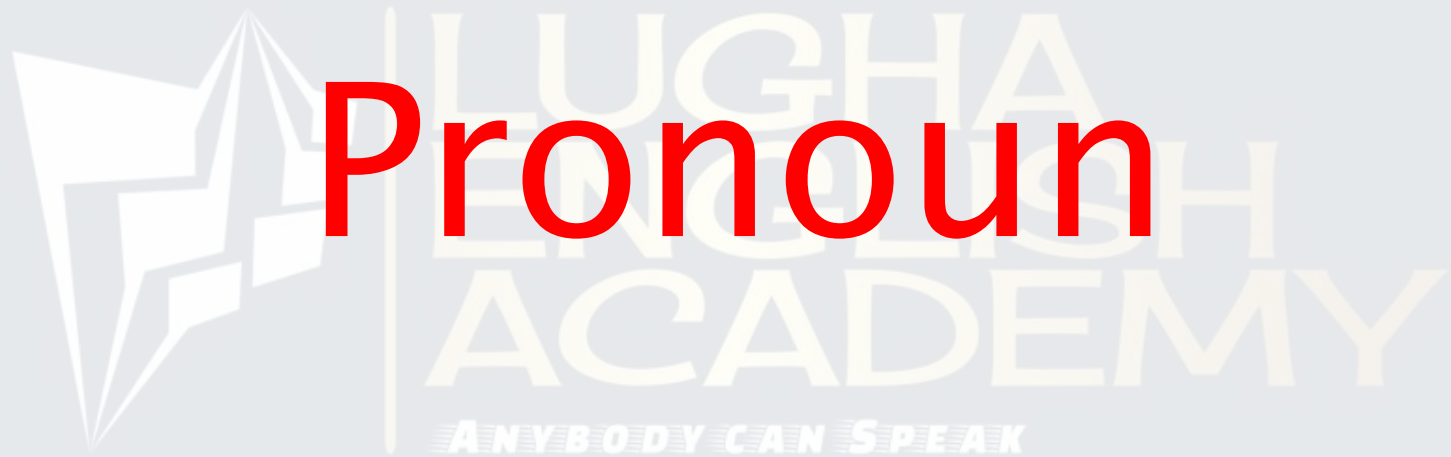

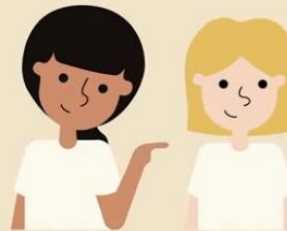

Object Pronouns

Examples:

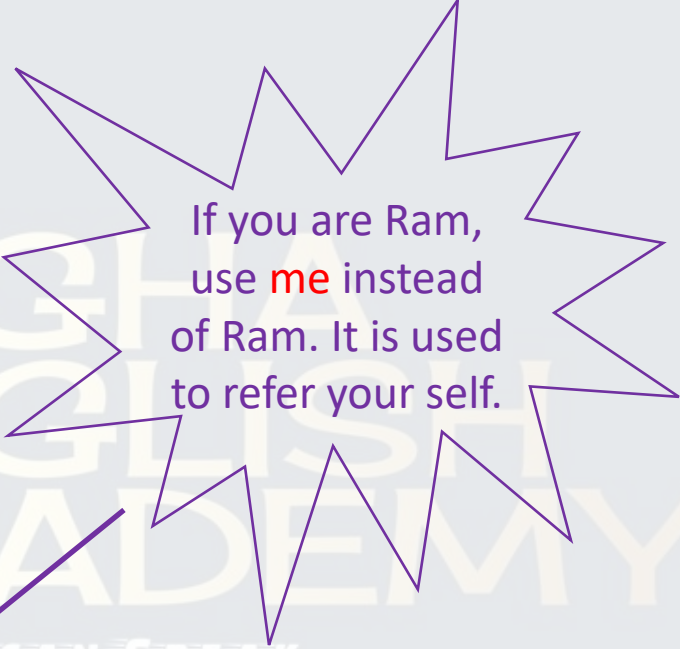
1. Joey and Mary are playing with my friends.
Joey and Mary are playing with them.
2. Jagan is talking to my brother.
Jagan is talking to him.
3. Ram don't know the answer.
Ram don't know it.
4. Tom is waiting for Priya.
Tom is waiting for her.
5. The teacher told Sam and me to paint.
The teacher told us to paint.

Examples

Pronoun **Me**

Hi, it's Ram.

It was liked by Ram.



If you are Ram,
use **me** instead
of Ram. It is used
to refer your self.



Hi, it's **me**.

It was liked by **me**.

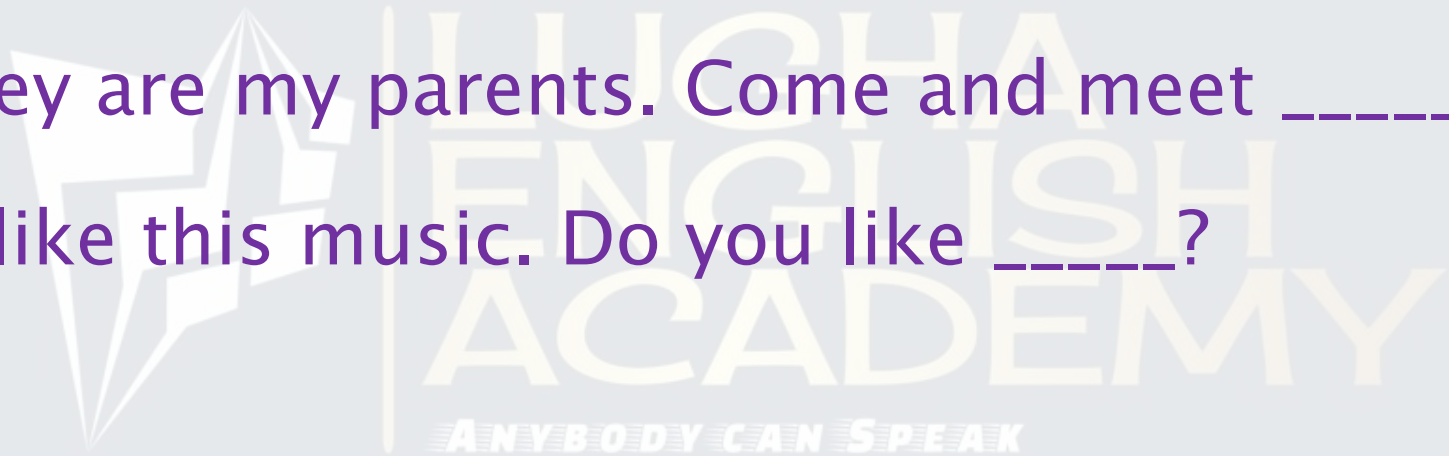
