Do, Does, and Did

The words 'do', 'does' and 'did' are all forms of the verb 'to do'. They fall under auxiliary verbs.

Examples :

- a. Do you live in Mumbai?
- b. Does he live with you?
- c. Did he meet you?
- Now, 'do' has three forms. They are do, does and did.
- All of these three forms are used in different contexts

VERBS

DO

- Used with the simple present tense.
- Used with pronouns I, we, they, you.
- Example: I do my work regularly.

DID

- Used with the simple past tense.
- 'Do' and 'Does' become 'Did' in the past tense.
- Example: I did my work.

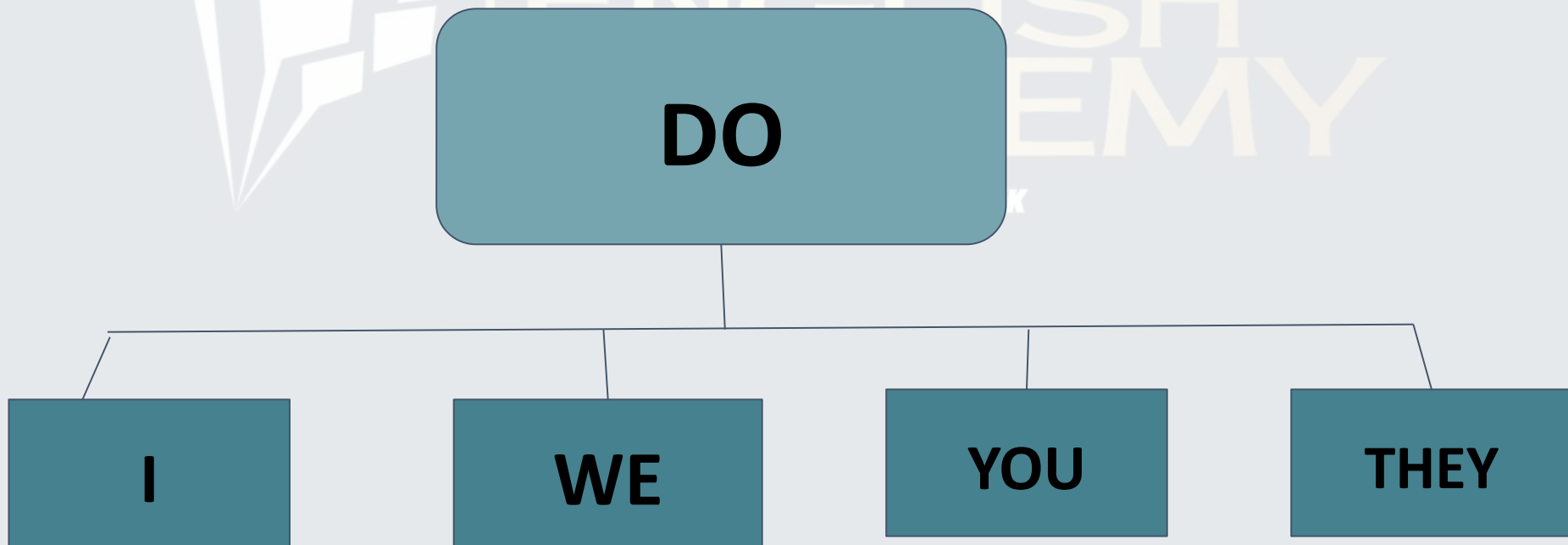
DOES

- Used with the simple present tense.
- Used with pronouns he, she, it.
- Example: He does all the work by himself.

ANYBODY CAN SPEAK

A) Do

- We use 'do' only in the present and future tense and when the subject is plural. Also, it is used with pronouns 'I', 'you', 'they', 'we' and plural nouns.
- The word 'do' is used to ask questions about present or future actions.



EXAMPLES-DO

Affirmative	Negative	Interrogative
You Speak English.	You do not Speak English.	Do you Speak English?
I work a lot.	I do not work a lot.	Do I work a lot?
They eat a cake.	They do not eat a cake.	Do they eat a cake?
We play in the park.	We do not play in the park.	Do we play in the park?

B) Does

- Similar to 'Do', we use 'Does' with a simple present tense. It is used when the subject is singular. It is also used with third person pronouns he, she and it.

DOES

EXAMPLES-DOES

Affirmative	Negative	Interrogative
He Speaks English.	He does not Speak English.	Does he Speak English?
She works a lot.	She does not work a lot.	Does she work a lot?
It flies high in the sky	It does not fly high in the sky.	Does it fly high in the sky?
Madhu plays in the park.	Madhu does not play in the park.	Does Madhu play in the park?

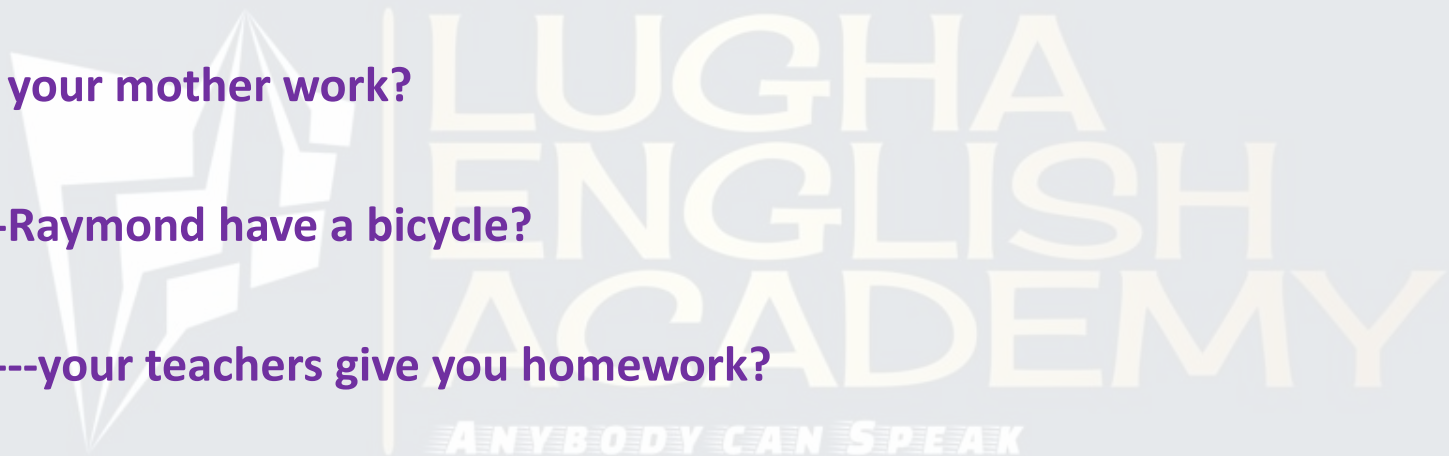

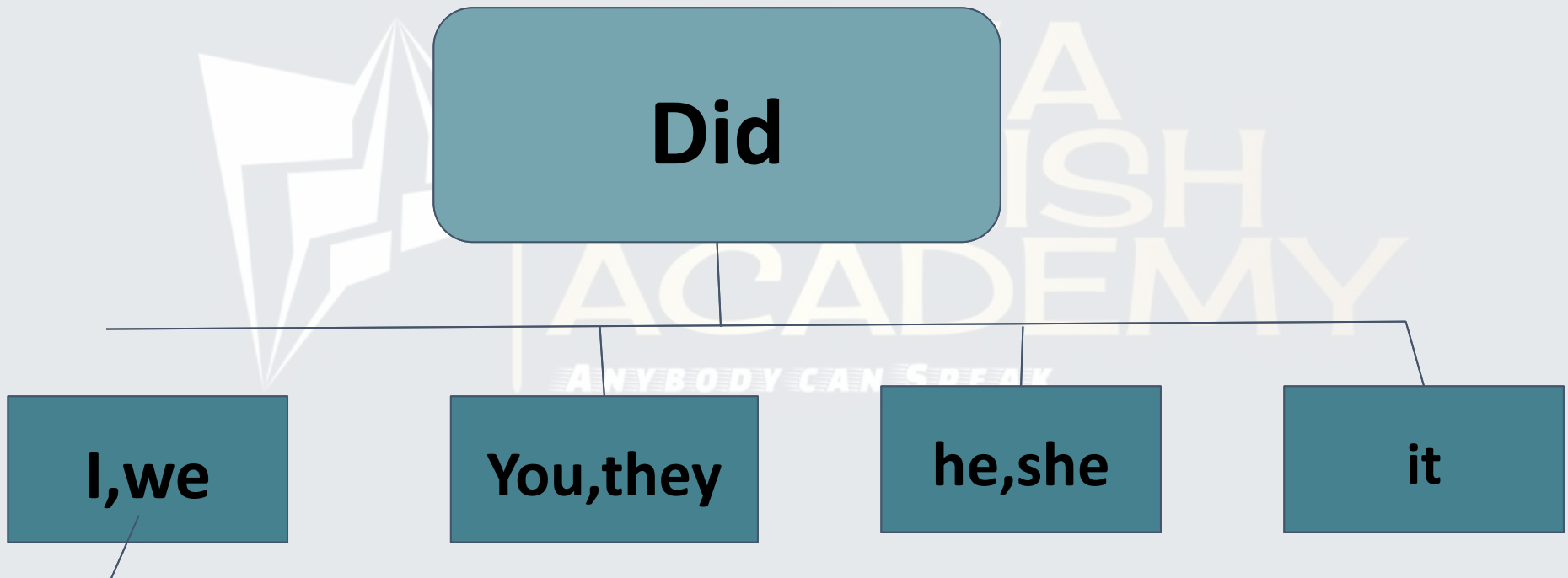

C) Did

- 'Did' is the past tense of 'do'. We use it when we need to talk about something that happened in the past



EXAMPLES-DID

Affirmative	Negative	Interrogative
He Spoke English.	He did not Speak English.	Did he Speak English?
She worked a lot.	She did not work a lot.	Did she work a lot?
It flew high in the sky	It did not fly high in the sky.	Did it fly high in the sky?
Madhu played in the park.	Madhu did not play in the park.	Did Madhu play in the park?
