

Simple future tense



- **Simple future tense** indicates **an action that will happen in the future.**
- A **simple future tense** is formed by using the helping verb **will (or shall)** with the base form of the verb.

For example: *ANYBODY CAN SPEAK*

I will clean my room.

Simple Future Tense



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We use "will" to talk about the future:
When we make predictions.

Simple Past

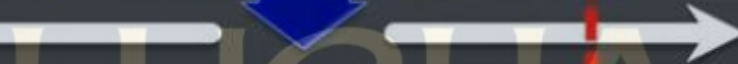
played
studied
drove
cooked
rode

Simple Present

play
study
drive
cook
ride

Simple Future

will play
will study
will drive
will cook
will ride



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Simple Future Tense



It is used to talk about a **time later than now**, and to express **facts or certainty**.

It is something that hasn't happened yet, but **going to** happen.

Simple Present

We **play** football every weekend.

Simple Future

We **will** **play** football next weekend.

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Sentence Examples

Present Tense

pay

carry

cook

rain

inform

Future Tense

I **will pay** for the movie tickets.

He **will carry** the bags for you.

We **will cook** for dinner tonight.

It **will rain** tomorrow morning.

They **will inform** us about the results.

Abbreviated Forms

I will → **I'll** **You will** → **You'll**
They will → **They'll** **We will** → **We'll**
He will → **He'll** **She will** → **She'll**
It will → **It'll** **Will not** → **Won't**

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Simple future tense

- sentences
- negative sentences

Subject	Singular	Plural
First person	I	We
Second person	You	You
Third person	He, She, It, Name (ex: Sam)	They

For each sentence of any tense has a basic formula.

a) Sentences – simple future

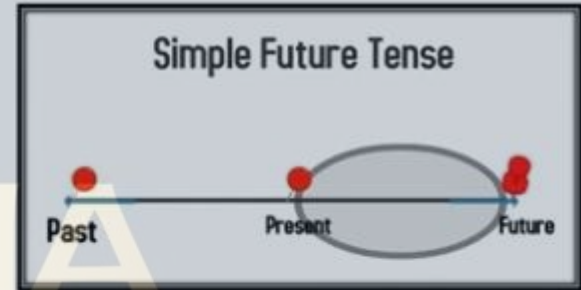
Subject	to be + verb (v1)	+ object
I, We	shall play	football
You, They, He, She, It, Sam (Name)	will play	football

Example:

- i) I shall play football.
- ii) We shall play football.
- iii) You will play football.
- iv) They will play football.
- v) He will play football.
- vi) She will play football.
- vii) It will play football.
- viii) Sam will play football.

Negative Sentences

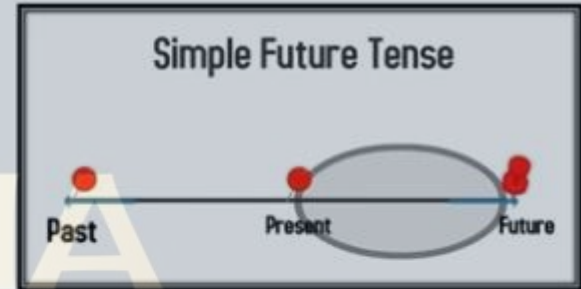

James won't be a doctor.

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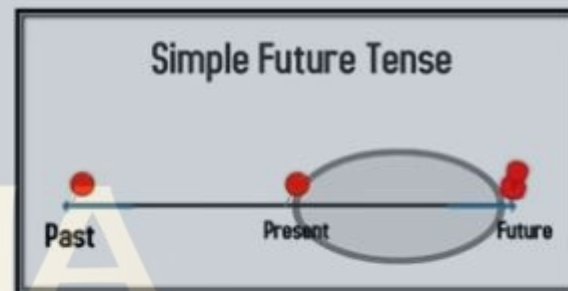
Negative Sentences (-)



My mother won't clean the kitchen tomorrow.

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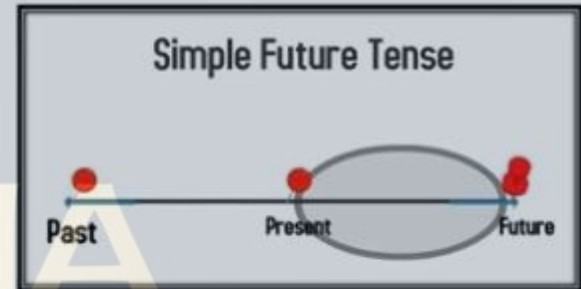
Negative Sentences (-)

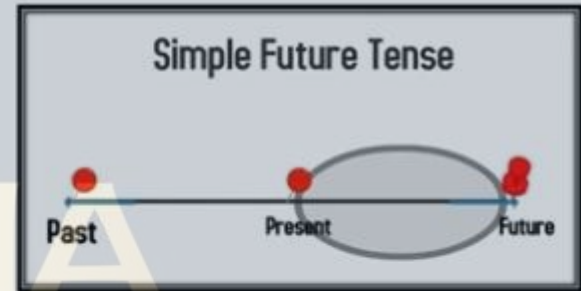
She won't miss you in future.

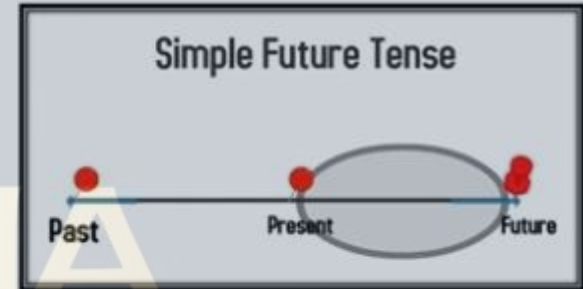

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b) Negative sentences – simple future

Subject	to be (not) + verb (v1)	+ object
I, We	(shall not / shan't) Ex: go	to school
You, They, He, She, It, Sam (Name)	(will not / won't) Ex: go	to school

Example :

i) I shall go to school.	i) I shall not (shan't) go to school.
ii) We shall go to school.	ii) We shan't go to school.
iii) You will go to school.	iii) You won't go to school.
iv) They will go to school.	iv) They won't go to school.
v) He will go to school.	v) He won't go to school.
vi) She will go to school.	vi) She won't go to school.
vii) It will go to school.	vii) It won't go to school.
viii) Sam will go to school.	viii) Sam won't go to school.

To Ask Questions

- **Will** you marry me?
- **Will** I see him again?
- **Will** Jane come to office?
- **Will** they play tomorrow?
- **Will** we go for the match tonight?
- **Will** he collect the letters?

Answers (Abbreviated Future Tense)

- Yes, **I'll** marry you.
- **You'll** see him again next year.
- No, she **won't be** coming.
- Yes, **they'll** play tomorrow.
- **We'll** go for the match if it doesn't rain tonight.
- Yes, **he'll** collect the letters later.

c) Questions – simple future

Subject	to be + verb	+ object
I, We	(shall) Ex: sing	song
You, They, It, He, She, It, We, You	(will) Ex: sing
