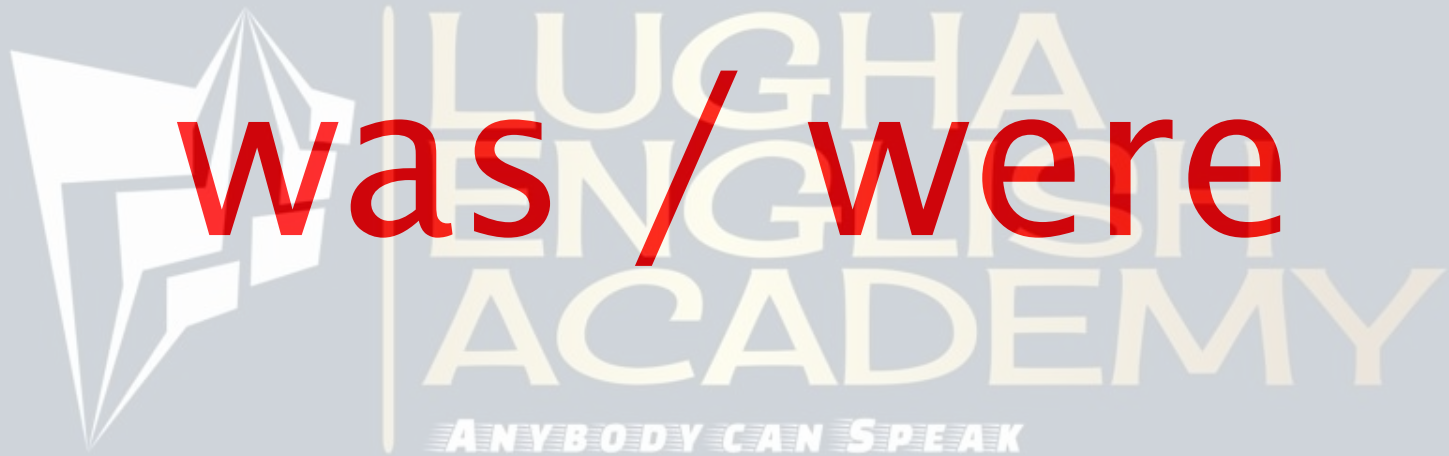

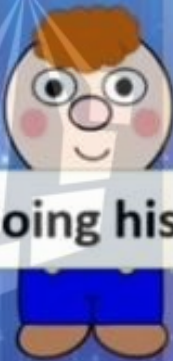

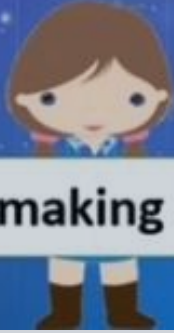
Were – Used with Noun Plural



The dogs were barking.



Children were playing in the park.



The students were making noise in the class.

was / were

Subject	Singular	Plura
First person	I	We
Second person	You	You
Third person	He, She, It, Name (ex: Sam)	They

Use of was / were

- used in past tense

(Past tense used to talk about conditions that happened already)

was -> singular objects (except you) – I, He, She, It, Name

were -> plural objects (you – exception-singular and plural), we, they

Verbs in English comes in three main categories

- The Affirmative
- The Negative
- The Interrogative

* **The Affirmative** -> asserting that something is true or valid.

* **The Negative** -> denying something.

* **The Interrogative** -> asking a question.

Affirmative	Negative	Interrogative
I was You were He was She was It was We were They were Ravi (name) was Examples:	I was not You were not He was not She was not It was not We were not They were not Ravi was not	Was I? Were you? Was he? Was she? Was it? Were we? Were they? Was Ravi?

I was a doctor -> Affirmative

He was not a doctor -> Negative

Were you a doctor ? -> Interrogative

Examples using 'was' and 'were' - Affirmative

- * I was reading.
- * You were studying.
- * He was collecting stamps.
- * She was dancing.
- * It was dark and cloudy.
- * We were friends.
- * They were distributing sweets.
- * Ravi was a cobbler.

Examples using 'was' and 'were' - Negative

- * I was not biting my nails.
- * You were not lying.
- * He was not scolding others.
- * She was not scribbling on the wall.
- * It was not heavy to lift.
- * We were not fighting with each other.
- * They were not destroying the forest.
- * Ravi was not a thief.

Examples using 'was' and 'were' - Interrogative

- * Was I reading a newspaper?
- * Were you admitted in the hospital?
- * Was he paying attention?
- * Was it dangerous?
- * Were we struggling to answer the questions?
- * Was she covering all her books?
- * Were they new to school?
- * Was Ravi a policeman?

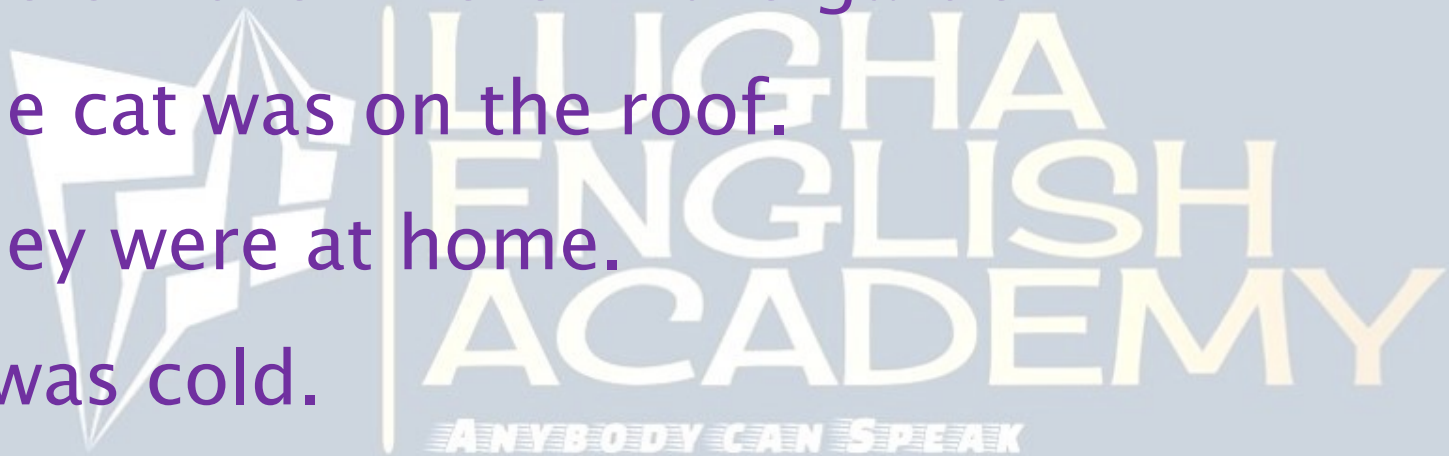

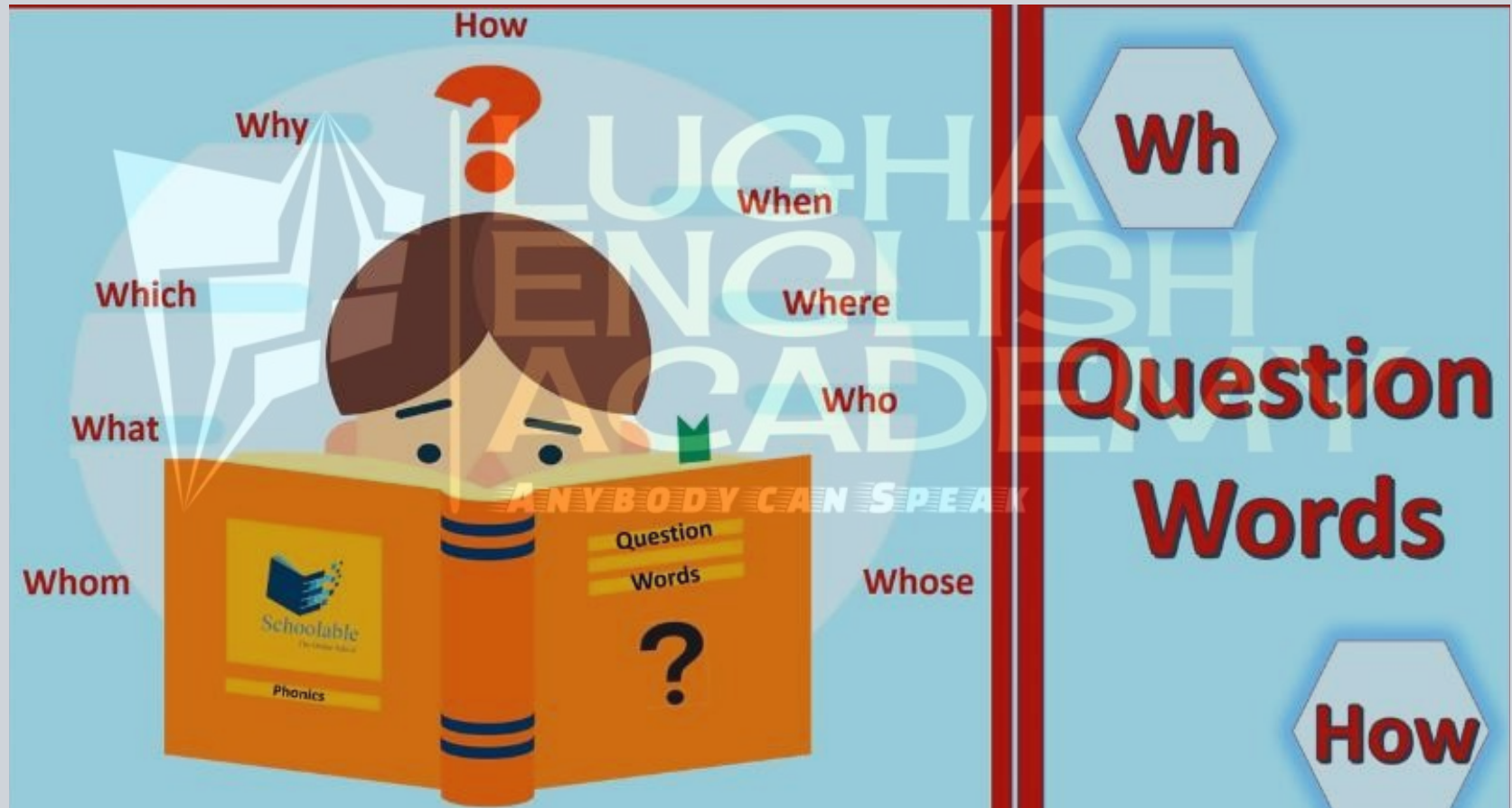

Wh – Questions (was/were)

- are also called information questions because we are trying to get some specific information from another person (not just a 'yes' or 'no' answer)

Be verbs (formula)

WH + Be + Subject

Example : What was that noise?
Why were you late?
What were you doing?

Wh – Questions (was / were)

Question words

1. Who – person

Ex: Who was that ?

2. Where - place

Ex: Where were you going?

3. Why - reason

Ex: Why were you starving?

4. How – condition or quality of something

Ex: How was the party?

5. What – object, idea or action

Ex: What was your job?

Wh – Questions (was / were)

Question words

6. Which – choice

Ex: Which one was your ball?

7. Whose – possession

Ex: Whose purse was that?

8. When – time, occasion, moment

Ex: When was your wedding?

9. How many – number of items

Ex: How many cars were there?

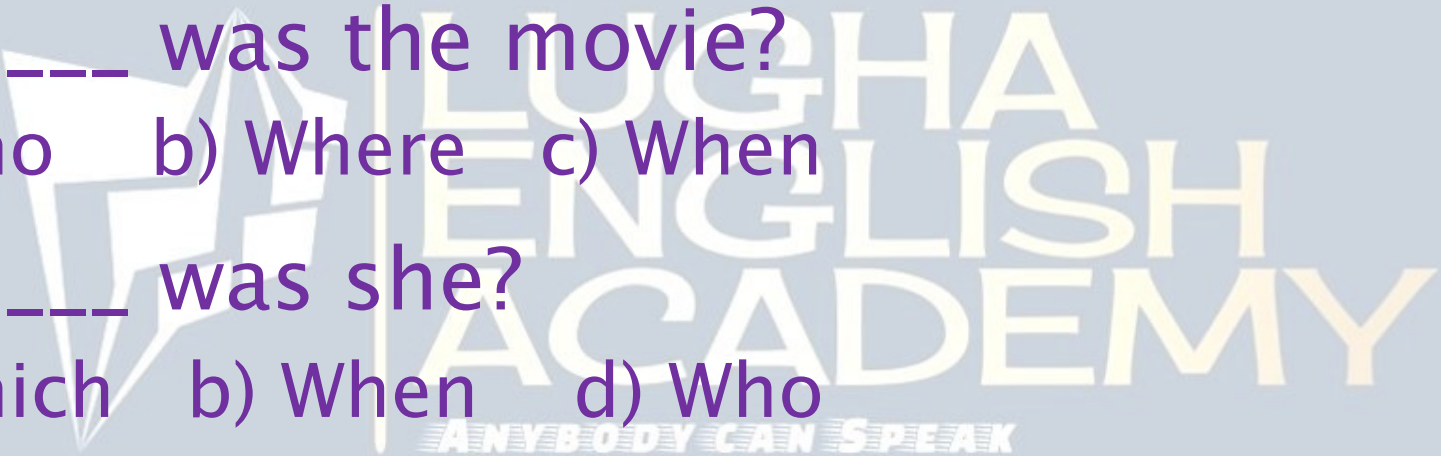
