SUN

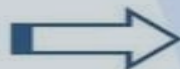

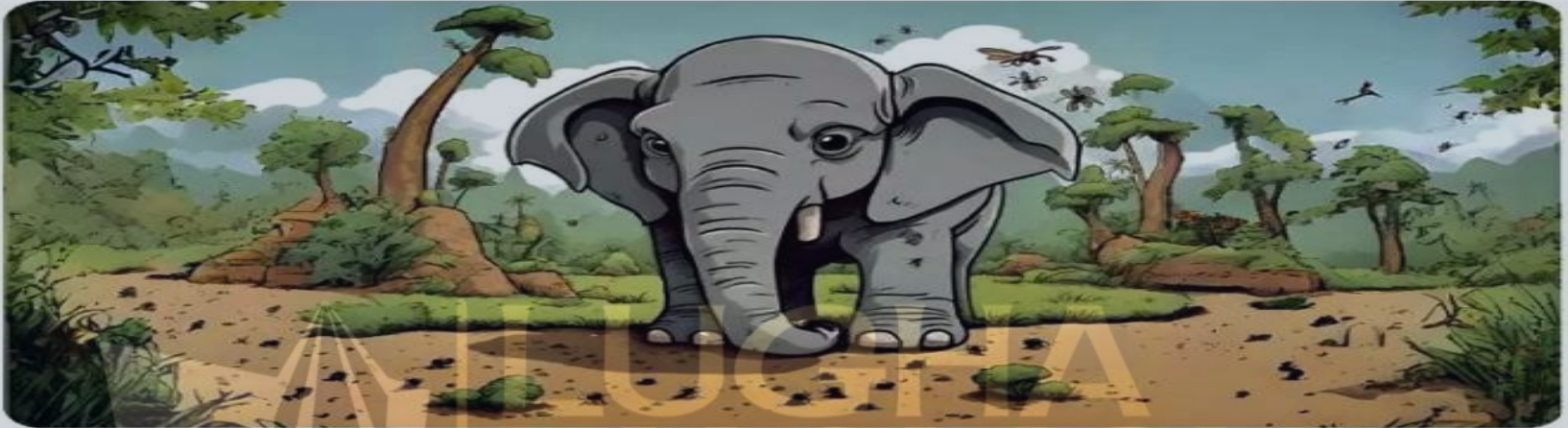
9. The Lion and the Poor Slave

This made the tree very sad. Wherever it looked at the other trees, it sighed, "I wish I was like other beautiful trees. God has been cruel to me."

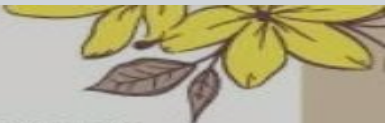
One day, a wood-cutter came to the forest. He saw the hunchback tree and grumbled, "This twisted tree is useless for me."
