Past	was, were
Future	will, shall
Perfect	have, has, had

Past perfect continuous tense

- it shows that an action that started in the past continued up until another time in the past.

eg: Pavithra **had been walking** four miles a day before she broke her leg.

First person	I	We
Second person	You	You
Third person	He, She, It, Name (ex: Sam)	They

a) Sentences – past perfect continuous

Subject	to be (had) + been + verb+ing	+ object
I, You, We, They	had been playing	football
He, She, It, Sam	had been playing	football

Example:

- i) I had been playing football.
- ii) You had been playing football.
- iii) We had been playing football.
- iv) They had been playing football.
- v) He had been playing football.
- vi) She had been playing football.
- vii) It had been playing football.
- viii) Sam had been playing football.

b) Negative sentences – past perfect continuous

Subject	to be (had) + not been + verb + ing	+ object
I, You, We, They	had not (hadn't) been going	to school
He, She, It, Sam	had not (hadn't) been going	to school

Example :

1. I had been going to school.	1. I had not been going to school.
2. You had been going to school.	2. You had not been going to school.
3. We had been going to school.	3. We had not been going to school.
4. They had been going to school.	4. They had not been going to school.
5. He had been going to school.	5. He had not been going to school.
6. She had been going to school.	6. She had not been going to school.
7. It had been going to school.	7. It had not been going to school.
8. Sam had been going to school.	8. Sam had not been going to school.

c) Questions – past perfect continuous

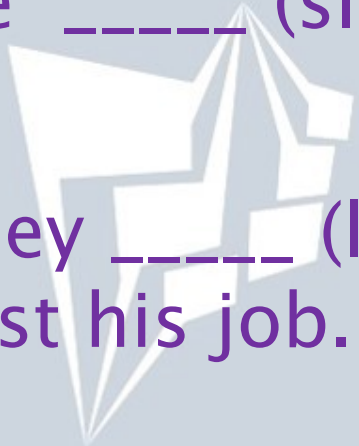
To be (had) + subject	been + verb +ing	+ object
Had I, Had you, Had we, Had they	been singing	song
Had he, Had she, Had it, Had Sam	been singing	song
