

Punctuation



I. Terminal Punctuation

– Terminal punctuation marks are used to end sentences. They are

period / full stop (.)

exclamation mark (!)

question mark (?)

period or full stop (.)

– The period is used to mark the end of two types of sentences.

* declarative sentences (sentences which give information)

eg : I teach English.
We had pizza for dinner last night.
If it rains tomorrow, I'll bring umbrella.

* imperative sentences (command or request)

eg : Please don't feed the animals.
If it rains tomorrow, bring your umbrella.

Exclamation mark (!)

– The exclamation mark (!) is used to convey strong emotion.

eg : I'm really excited about my new job (no emotion)
I'm really excited about my new job! (excitement)

If you come to work late tomorrow, you're fired!

(anger)

Hurray! We won the match. (excitement)

Johnny, don't play with your food! (strict command)

Ouch! You just stepped on my foot! (pain)

Wow! What a beautiful house (amazement)

Question mark (?)

– used to mark the end of the question.

eg : What do you do?

Are we allowed to feed the animals?

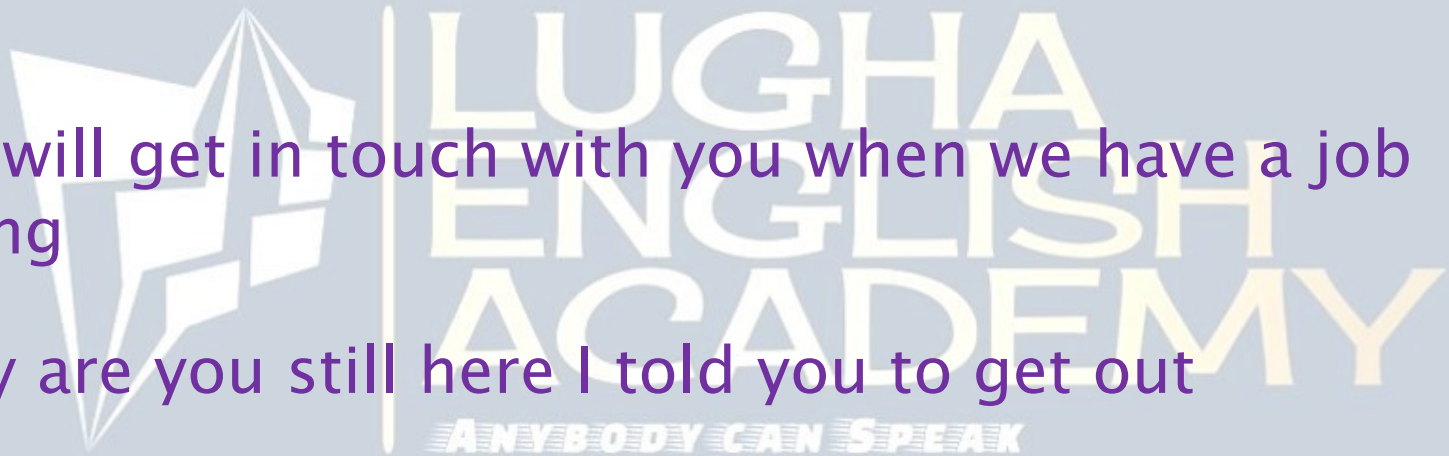
If it rains tomorrow, should I bring my umbrella?

Are you excited about your new job?

Who lives in that house?

Add periods, exclamation marks and question marks.

1. The sun rises in the east it sets in the west
2. I'm going to the supermarket Do you want to come along

II. Pauses

– Pauses tell the reader to stop briefly and then continue reading. They are

comma (,)
semicolon (;)
colon (:)



Pauses – comma (,)

- 1. separates items in a list.

Rule : put a comma after every item except the last.

eg : We need to buy milk, eggs, flour, and sugar for the cake. (, before the 'and' is optional)

Also, notice that there is no space before the comma but there is a space after each one. This is the correct formatting.

if we have only 2 items, don't use a comma

eg : We need to buy eggs **and** flour for the cake

* The car is spacious, stylish, and affordable

* Why don't you go upstairs, take a shower and get ready to leave.

Pauses – comma (,)

– 2. separates words that are not part of the sentence.

Sentence adverbs : unfortunately, frankly, eagerly, unknowingly, etc.,

eg : Unfortunately, he missed the flight.
Frankly, I don't care about him.

– 3. Forms of address, in formal letters and emails.

eg : Sir, please have a seat.

Madam, can I get you something to eat.

(Greeting) : Dear sir, Dear madam, Dear Ragu,

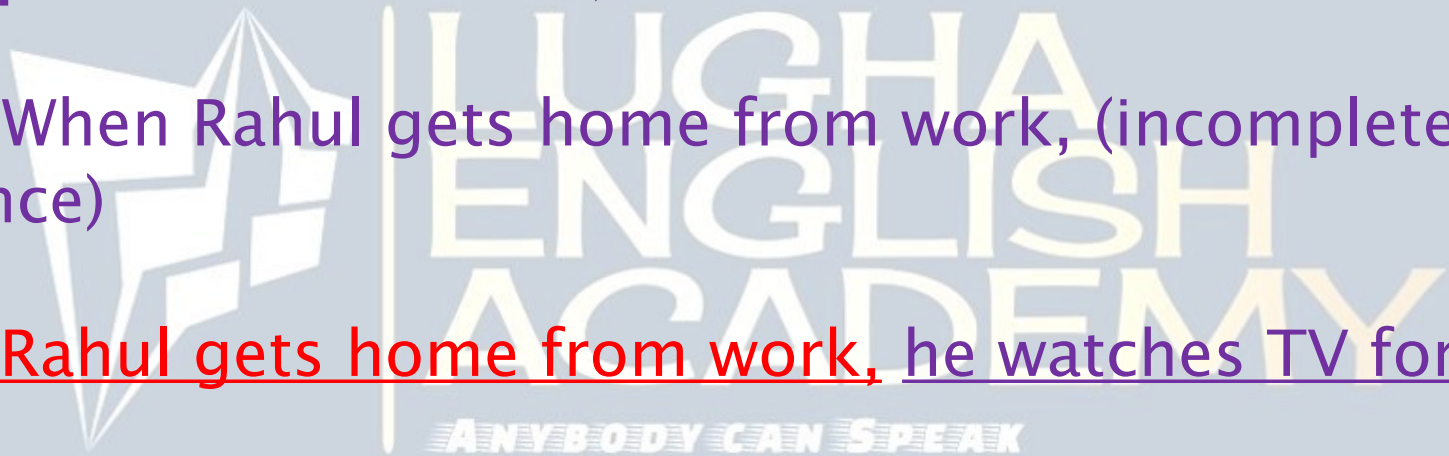
(Closing) : yours faithfully, yours truly,

Pauses – comma (,)

– 4. clauses : dependent clause
(incomplete sentence) + independent clause
(complete sentence)

eg : When Rahul gets home from work, (incomplete sentence)

When Rahul gets home from work, he watches TV for an hour.

Pauses – semicolon (;)

– The semicolon (;) is used to combine closely related sentences.

eg : I went to see a movie with my wife. I thought it was amazing. She thought it was terrible. (closely related sentence)

-> *Instead of ending a sentence and starting a new one (closely related sentences) we can use a semicolon (;)*

Eg : I thought it was amazing; she thought it was terrible.

Note : No space before semicolon. After a semicolon add a space.

Pauses – semicolon (;)

– The semicolon (;) is used to combine closely related sentences.

Examples :

Her parents wanted her to be a doctor;
however, she had other plans.

This is a great book; in fact, it one of the best I have ever read.

Pauses – colon (:)

- The colon (:) introduces information after an independent clause.
- Colon is used when we introduce list of items and after clauses.

eg: Lists

1. Danny's seafood restaurant specializes in four items :

prawn,
shrimp,
crab and
lobster

2. Whenever you drive you must do the following :

wear your seatbelt,
obey traffic rules and
keep your eyes on the road

Pauses – colon (:)

- The colon (:) introduces information after an independent clause.
- Colon is used when we introduce list of items and after clauses.

eg: Clauses

1. Let me make this very clear: if you fail in another test, I'm taking away all your video games.

Note : When we use a colon don't leave a space before it but do leave a space after it.

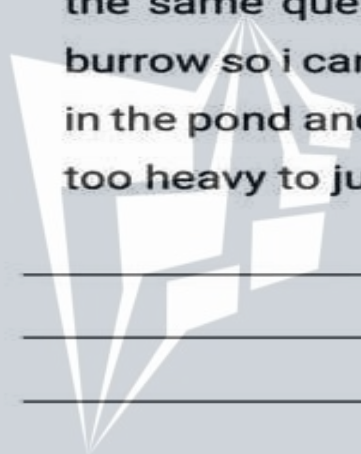

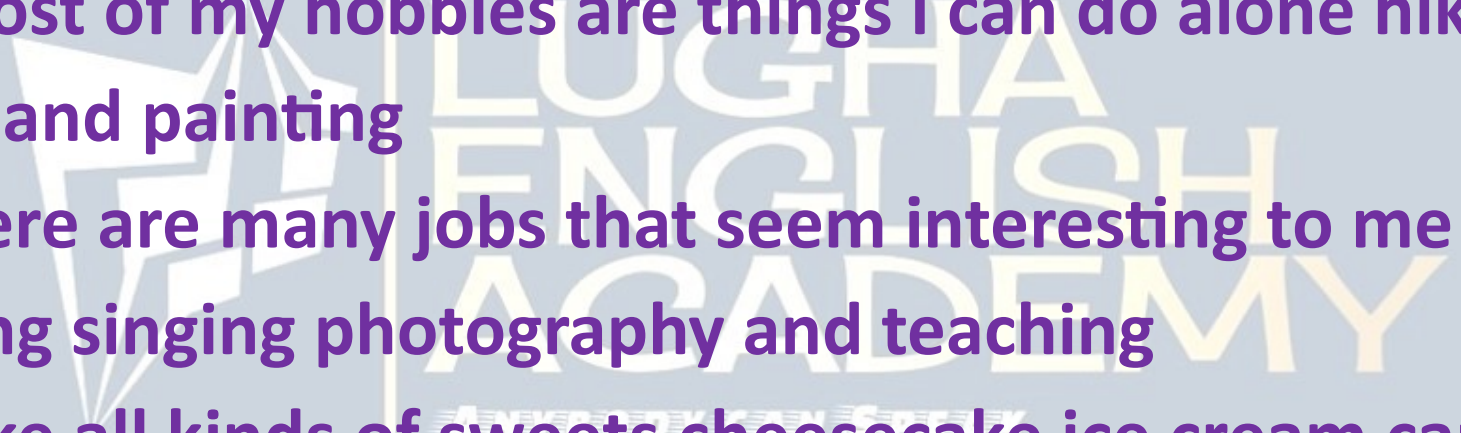
