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▶ KINDS OF NOUNS – DETAILED EXPLANATION

1. Common Noun

Definition:

A general name for a person, place, thing, or idea.

Explanation:

- It does not refer to any specific individual or item.
- Written with a lowercase letter unless it starts a sentence.
- Can be countable or uncountable.

Examples:

- girl, school, river, country, doctor, fruit

In Sentences:

- The boy is playing.
- She went to a market.

✓ 2. Proper Noun

Definition:

The specific name of a particular person, place, organization, or thing.

Explanation:

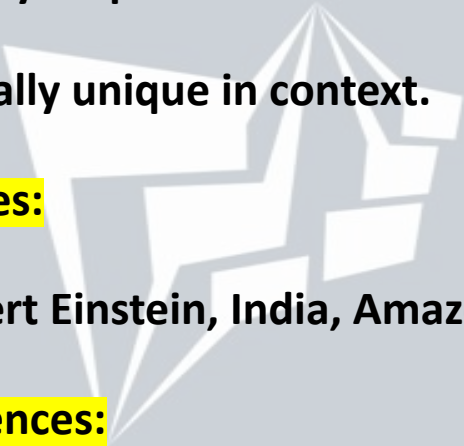
- Always capitalized.
- Usually unique in context.

Examples:

- Albert Einstein, India, Amazon River, Monday, Google

In Sentences:

- London is a big city.
- Mount Everest is the tallest mountain in the world.



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✓ 3. Abstract Noun

Definition:

A noun that names an idea, quality, emotion, or state, not something you can see or touch.

Explanation:

- Cannot be experienced with the five senses.
- Often formed from adjectives, verbs, or common nouns.

Examples:

- honesty (from honest)
- happiness (from happy)
- growth (from grow)
- childhood, freedom, anger, justice

In Sentences:

- Courage is what you need in difficult times.
- Her beauty stunned everyone.

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✓ 4. Concrete Noun

Definition:

Names of things that can be perceived through the senses — seen, touched, heard, smelled, or tasted.

Explanation:

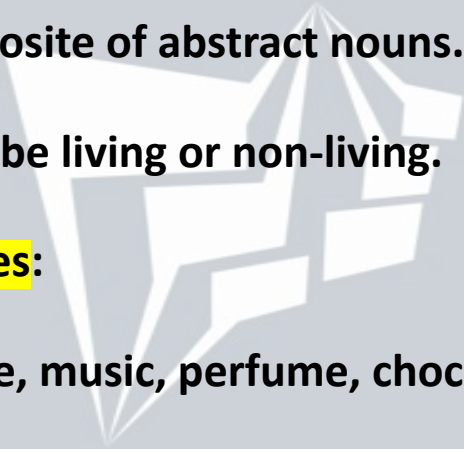
- Opposite of abstract nouns.
- Can be living or non-living.

Examples:

- table, music, perfume, chocolate, cat, teacher

In Sentences:

- The flowers smell nice.
- I heard a loud noise.



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✓ 5. Collective Noun

Definition:

A noun that refers to a group or collection of people, animals, or things treated as a single unit.

Explanation:

- Often used with singular verbs in British English; sometimes plural in American English depending on context.

Examples:

- team, class, audience, flock, bunch, army, pack

In Sentences:

- The team is practicing for the finals.
- A flock of birds flew over us.

✓ 6. Countable Noun

Definition:

Nouns that can be counted individually.

Explanation:

- Have both singular and plural forms.
- Can use numbers or quantifiers like many, few, several.

Examples:

- apple/apples, chair/chairs, idea/ideas

In Sentences:

- I have two books.
- There are many cars on the road.

✓ 7. Uncountable Noun

Definition:

Nouns that refer to things we cannot count individually.

Explanation:

- No plural form.
- Use quantifiers like much, a little, some, a lot of, not numbers.

Examples:

- water, sand, milk, sugar, information, knowledge

In Sentences:

- She gave me some information.
- We need water to survive.

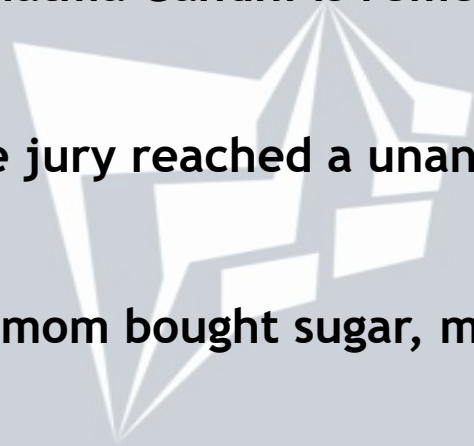

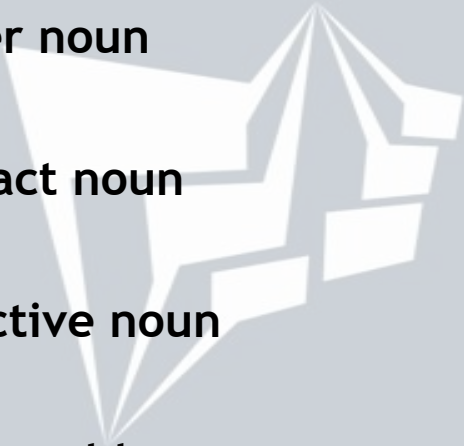
