	simple	continuous	perfect	perfect continuous

Usage of Tenses

1. Present simple tense

form : subject + verb (present / v1)

Example :

I **drink** coffee every morning. (*habits and routines*)

Cathy **works** as a teacher. (*facts*)

Some more examples :

- * Shawn **goes** to the beach on Sundays.
- * Children often **play** video games after school.
- * You **sing** very well.
- * Water **boils** at 100 °C

Present tense is all about our habits, and routines. Facts about people or things.

Usage of Tenses

2. Present continuous tense

form : subject + am/is/are + verb (v1) + ing

-> Actions happening now (*at the time of speaking*)

I **am drinking** coffee right now.

We **are having** breakfast.

It **is raining** outside.

-> Temporary activities

Arun **is learning** to play the piano.

I **am watching** an interesting TV series.

-> Changes taking place now.

The price of crude oil **is falling** rapidly.

Scientists says the Earth **is getting** warmer.

Usage of Tenses

3. Past simple tense

form : subject + verb (past / v2)

-> Completed actions in the past

I **played** football with my friends.

He **gave** us a present for our anniversary.

We **received** the package the morning.

4. Past continuous tense

form : subject + was/were + verb (v2) + ing

-> Unfinished, on going actions in the past (+ finished action)

I **was having** dinner with my family when the doorbell rang.

It **was raining** when Priya left for work.

They **were studying** when the teacher left the classroom.

Usage of Tenses

5. Present perfect tense

form : subject + have / has + verb (past participle v3)

-> Experience (It talks about experience, ie., the time period is continuing or ongoing)

I **have taught** English to many students.

Anu **has visited** France four times.

We **have seen** two movies this week.

-> Recent activities or events

I **have finished** my homework.

My grandma **has lost** her glasses.

The police **have arrested** a young man in connection with the robbery.

Usage of Tenses

6. Present perfect continuous tense

form : subject + have / has been + verb (v3) + ing

-> Actions that started and still continuing.

I **have been waiting** to see the doctor for 2 hours.

It **has been raining** since 4 a.m.

We **have been living** in this town since 1980.

Usage of Tenses

7. Past perfect tense

form : subject + had + verb (past participle v3)

-> The first past action (when there are two or more past actions)

When we got to the theatre, the movie ***had started***.

I was sick because I ***had eaten*** too much food.

The girl looked very familiar. I ***had seen*** her somewhere before.

8. Past perfect continuous tense

form : subject + had been + verb (v3) + ing

-> The first (continuous) past action (when there are two or more past actions).

I felt really tired because I ***had been driving*** all day.

She ***had been waiting*** for two hours when the doctor finally arrived.

Usage of Tenses

9. Future simple tense

as three forms

a) going to

b) present continuous (using an 'ing' verb)

c) will

a) Going to -> plans and intentions

form : subject + am/is/are going to + verb (v1)

Ex :

1. We *are going to buy* a car.

2. I *am going to exercise* regularly.

3. Rahul *is going to take* a break from work.

Usage of Tenses

9. Future simple tense

as three forms

- a) going to
- b) present continuous (using an 'ing' verb)
- c) will

b) Present continuous -> fixed arrangements

form : subject + am/in/are + verb (ing)

Ex :

1. I **am having** lunch with my parents on Saturday.
2. We **are flying** to Mumbai the day after tomorrow.
3. John **is giving** a presentation to the board of directors on the 10th of this month.

Future simple

Going to vs. Present continuous

I ***am going to see*** the dentist sometime next week. (plan)

I ***am seeing*** the dentist tomorrow afternoon. (arrangement)

We ***are going to get married*** this year. (plan)

We ***are getting married*** on April 21st. (arrangement)

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Usage of Tenses

9. Future simple tense

as three forms

a) going to

b) present continuous (using an 'ing' verb)

c) will

c) will -> instant decisions, offers, promises.

form : subject + will + verb

Ex :

1. I will eat the burger.

2. She will help you to carry the files.

3. I shall take you for a ride.

Usage of Tenses

10. Future continuous tense

form : subject + will be + verb (ing)

-> on going actions in the future

Ex:

1. At 11 a.m. Tomorrow, I ***will be driving*** to Portland.

2. I ***will be going*** to cafeteria in a little while.

Usage of Tenses

11. Future perfect tense

form : subject + will have + verb (v3)

-> completed actions in the future

Ex:

1. By August, Aaron *will have saved* the money.
2. By 5pm we *will have painted* the room.

12. Future perfect continuous tense

form : subject + will have been + verb (ing)

-> on going action in the future (with duration)

Ex:

1. By August, Aaron *will have been saving* the money for six months.
2. By 5 p.m. we *will have been painting* the living room for 10 hours.

2. Present continuous

I *am drinking* coffee right now.



3. Past simple

I *drank* coffee yesterday.



4. Past continuous

I *was drinking* coffee this morning when I got a phone call from my boss.



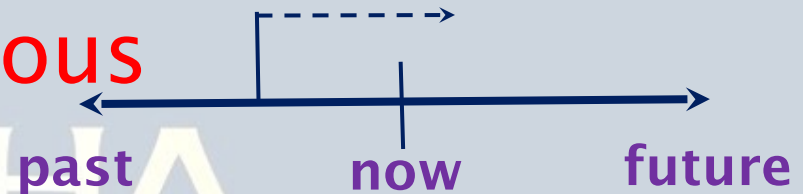
5. Present perfect

I *have washed* the dishes.



6. Present perfect continuous

I *have been washing* the dishes for half an hour.



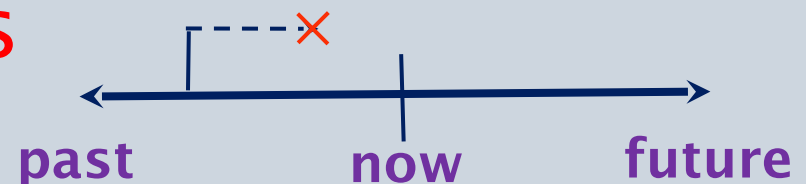
7. Past perfect

When I *left* for work, I *had washed* the dishes.



8. Past perfect continuous

When the phone *rang*, I *had been washing* the dishes for half an hour.



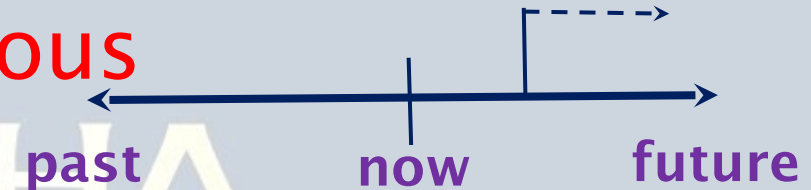
9. Simple future

He *will tell* you the story.



10. Simple future continuous

He *will be telling* you the story by tomorrow evening.



11. Future perfect

He *will have told* the story by tomorrow evening.



12. Future perfect continuous

By tomorrow evening, he *will have been telling* the story for half an hour.



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
