▶ What is a Preposition?

- ▶ A preposition is a word that links a noun or pronoun to another word in a sentence. It helps to show relationships between words, such as where, when, why, or how something happens. The noun or pronoun that follows a preposition is called the object of the preposition.

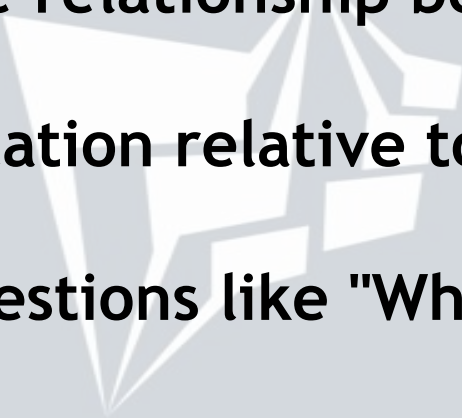

1. Prepositions of Place/Position

- ▶ Prepositions of place or position are words that show the relationship between a noun or pronoun and its location relative to another object. They answer questions like "Where?" or "In what position?"



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Preposition	Meaning	Example
in	Inside something or within a defined area	The keys are in the drawer.
on	Resting on the surface of something	The book is on the table.
at	A specific point or location	She is at the bus stop.
under	Lower than or beneath something	The shoes are under the bed.
over	Directly above something, but not touching	The airplane is flying over the city.
between	In the space separating two people or things	The child is sitting between his parents.
behind	At the back of something or someone	The cat is hiding behind the curtain.
above	Higher than something (can indicate a level or position)	The clock is above the door.
below	Lower than something (can indicate a level or position)	The temperature is below freezing.
next to	Very close to or beside something	He is sitting next to his friend.
near	Close to, but not necessarily directly beside	There is a coffee shop near my house.

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► **Prepositions of Time**

► **Describe when something happens.**

► **Common Prepositions of Time:**

1. At - Refers to a specific time or point in time.

☐ Example: *The meeting starts at 9 AM.*

☐ Use: Clock times, specific holidays (without "Day"), and specific points.

☐ *We'll meet at midnight.*

2. On - Refers to specific days, dates, or parts of a specific day.

☐ Example: *She was born on Christmas Day.*

☐ Use: Days, dates, and holidays with "Day."

☐ *I have an appointment on Monday.*

3. In - Refers to longer periods of time (months, years, centuries, parts of the day).

☐ Example: *They visited us in December.*

☐ Use: Months, years, centuries, and general parts of the day.

☐ *The movie was released in 2005.*

• **By – Refers to a deadline or the latest time something will happen.**

• Example: *I'll finish the report by tomorrow.*

• Use: Actions completed no later than a certain point.

• *Be home by 10 PM.*

• **Since – Refers to a starting point in time.**

• Example: *I have lived here since 2010.*

• Use: Refers to a point in time that continues up to the present.

• *He's been working here since March.*

• **For – Refers to a duration of time.**

• Example: *We've been waiting for two hours.*

• Use: Lengths of time.

• *She stayed in Paris for a week.*

Before – Refers to earlier than a certain point in time.

- ☐ Example: *We arrived before noon.*
- ☐ Use: Actions that happened earlier than a reference point.
 - ☐ *She left before dinner.*

After – Refers to later than a certain point in time.

- ☐ Example: *He went to bed after midnight.*
- ☐ Use: Actions that happened later than a reference point.
 - ☐ *Let's meet after lunch.*

During - Refers to a period of time when something happens.

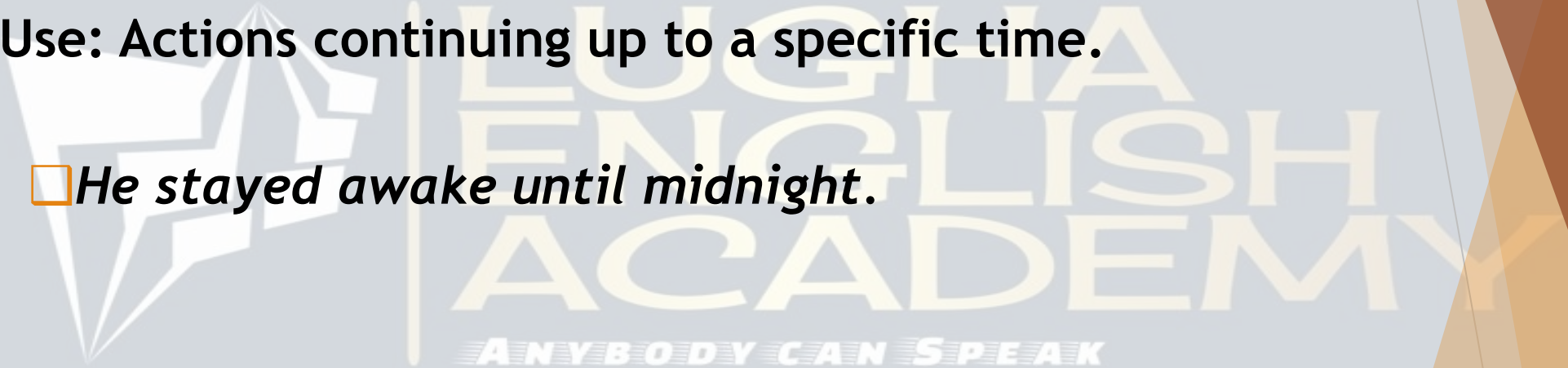
- ☐ Example: *I read a book during the flight.*
- ☐ Use: Actions that occur within a specific event or time frame.
 - ☐ *She cried during the movie.*

1. Until (or till) - Refers to up to a specific point in time.

☐ Example: *We waited until the rain stopped.*

☐ Use: Actions continuing up to a specific time.

☐ *He stayed awake until midnight.*

▶ Prepositions of Direction/Movement

- ▶ Prepositions of direction or movement are words that describe motion from one place to another. They indicate the path or direction in which someone or something is moving. These prepositions often follow verbs of motion, such as *go*, *move*, *run*, *walk*, *jump*, etc.

▶ Common Prepositions of Direction/Movement

▶ 1. To

- ▶ Indicates movement toward a specific destination.

- Example: *She is going to the park.*

▶ 2. Into

- ▶ Shows movement from the outside to the inside of something.

- Example: *He poured the water into the glass.*

▶ 3. Onto

- ▶ Describes movement toward a surface or position on something.

- Example: *The cat jumped onto the roof.*

▶ 4. Towards

- ▶ Shows movement in the direction of something, but not necessarily reaching it.

- Example: *They were heading towards the sea.*

▶ 5. Through

- ▶ Indicates movement within a space and exiting out the other side.
- Example: *The car drove through the tunnel.*

▶ 6. Across

- ▶ Shows movement from one side of a space, surface, or place to the other side.
- Example: *We swam across the lake.*

▶ 7. Along

- ▶ Indicates movement in a linear direction following a specific path.
- Example: *She walked along the beach.*

- ▶ Describes movement from one side to another while passing above something.
- Example: *The bird flew over the tree*

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- ▶ **Prepositions of Cause, Reason, or Purpose?**
- ▶ These prepositions show why something happens (cause or reason) or the goal of an action (purpose). They provide answers to "Why?", "For what reason?", or "For what purpose?" in a sentence.

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► Common Prepositions

1. **because of** - Expresses the cause or reason behind something.

Example: The road was closed because of heavy rain.

(Why was the road closed?)

2. **due to** - Similar to "because of," used to show the reason for something.

Example: The game was postponed due to technical issues.

3. **for** - Shows purpose, intent, or goal.

Example: This letter is for you. *(Who is it intended for?)*

4. **from** - Indicates the origin of a cause or reason.

Example: She learned patience from years of experience. *(What caused her patience?)*

5. **on account of** - Another way to express "because of."

Example: The match was canceled on account of bad weather.

1. Prepositions of Manner/agent/instrument

- ▶ Prepositions of manner, agent, and instrument indicate *how* something is done, *who* is responsible for an action, or *what* is used to perform an action. Here's a more detailed explanation:

- ▶

1. Prepositions of Manner

- These describe the way or method by which an action is performed.
- Common prepositions: *with, in, through, by.*
- Examples:
 - She solved the problem *with patience.*
 - They traveled *through the forest.*
 - He spoke *in a polite tone.*

▶ 2. Prepositions of Agent

- These show the doer or agent responsible for an action, often in a passive sentence.
- Common prepositions: *by*.
- Examples:
 - The book was written *by the famous author*.
 - The painting was admired *by everyone*.
 - The cake was baked *by my grandmother*.

▶ 3. Prepositions of Instrument

- These specify the tool, device, or means used to complete an action.
- Common prepositions: *with, by, through*.
- Examples:
 - She cut the paper *with scissors*.
 - The letter was sent *by post*.
 - He gained success *through hard work*.

▶ ***Prepositions of Possession:***

- ▶ ***Prepositions of possession express ownership, belonging, or connection between one thing and another. They help show who or what possesses or is associated with something. The most common prepositions used for possession are "of" and "to."***

▶ 1. Preposition "of"

- ▶ The preposition "of" is commonly used to indicate ownership, association, or a part-whole relationship.

▶ Examples and Usage:

- **Ownership:**

- *The legs of the chair are broken.*
(The chair owns the legs.)
- *The color of the car is blue.*
(The car owns the color.)

- **Association or Belonging:**

- *The members of the team were excited.*
(The team has members.)
- *The capital of France is Paris.*
(Paris belongs to France as its capital.)

- **Part-Whole Relationship:**

- *A slice of pizza was left on the plate.*
(The slice is a part of the whole pizza.)

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▶ 2. Preposition "to"

- ▶ The preposition "to" is used to indicate a connection or relationship, often showing belonging or attachment.

▶ Examples and Usage:

- **Belonging or Attachment:**

- *This book belongs to Sarah.*
(Sarah is the owner of the book.)
- *The key to the house is missing.*
(The key is associated with the house.)

- **Relationships or Links:**

- *The entrance to the building was locked.*
(The entrance is connected to the building.)
- *Her loyalty to the company is unquestionable.*
(She is emotionally attached or belongs to the company.)

To	Highlights attachment, belonging, or a connection	<i>The door to the office is locked.</i>
