

COMPOUND WORDS

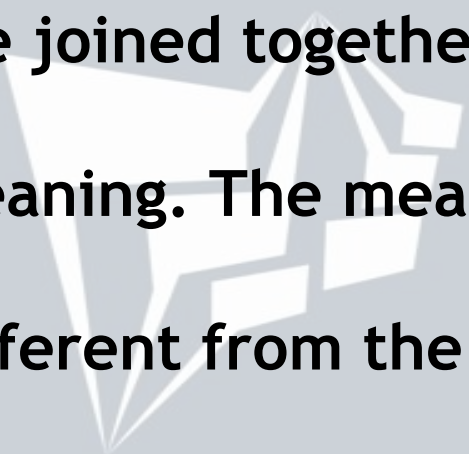


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▶ What are Compound Words?

- ▶ A compound word is formed when two or more words are joined together to create a new word with a unique meaning. The meaning of the compound word is usually different from the individual words that form it.



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► Types of Compound Words

► Compound words can be classified into three main types:

1. Closed Compound Words

- ☐ These are written as a single word without spaces or hyphens.
- ☐ Example: notebook, sunflower, bedroom, basketball

2. Hyphenated Compound Words

- ☐ These include a hyphen between the words to connect them.
- ☐ Example: mother-in-law, well-being, up-to-date, self-esteem

3. Open Compound Words

- ☐ These are written as separate words but function as a single unit of meaning.
- ☐ Example: ice cream, high school, living room, post office

▶ **Types of Compound Words**

- ▶ A compound word is formed when two or more words are combined to create a new word with a specific meaning. Compound words can be classified into three main types:

▶ **1. Closed Compound Words**

- ▶ These words are written as a single word without spaces or hyphens. The two words are joined together to form a new word that has a meaning different from its individual parts.

▶ **Examples:**

- notebook (note + book) → A book for writing notes
- sunflower (sun + flower) → A type of flower that follows the sun
- bedroom (bed + room) → A room where people sleep
- basketball (basket + ball) → A sport played with a ball and a basket

▶ **More Examples:**

- toothbrush
- classroom
- football
- newspaper

▶ 2. Hyphenated Compound Words

- ▶ These words use a hyphen (-) to link the words together. The hyphen helps clarify the meaning and pronunciation.

▶ Examples:

- mother-in-law (mother + in + law) → The mother of one's spouse
- well-being (well + being) → A state of health or happiness
- up-to-date (up + to + date) → Current, not outdated
- self-esteem (self + esteem) → Confidence in oneself

▶ More Examples:

- long-term
- check-in
- five-year-old
- editor-in-chief

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▶ 3. Open Compound Words

- ▶ These words are written as separate words but function as a single unit of meaning. Even though there is a space between the words, they are considered one word when used together.

▶ Examples:

- ice cream (ice + cream) → A frozen dessert
- high school (high + school) → A school for teenagers
- living room (living + room) → A room in a house for relaxing
- post office (post + office) → A place where mail is sent and received

▶ More Examples:

- full moon
- coffee table
- real estate
- peanut butter

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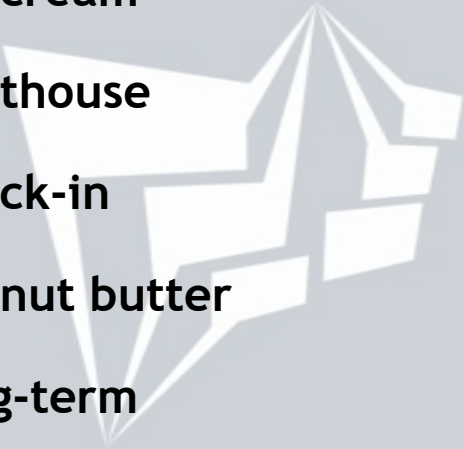
Key Differences Among Compound Words:

Type	Example	How It's Written
Closed Compound	notebook	One word, no space
Hyphenated Compound	mother-in-law	Words connected by a hyphen
Open Compound	ice cream	Separate words but used together
