Direct vs. Indirect speech

Reporting questions

1. Use a question-report verb like *ask*.
2. Change the pronouns, backshift the tense, change the time and place expressions.
3. Use statement word order.

Direct speech: "What do you want?" she asked me.

Indirect speech: She asked me what I wanted.

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1. Use a question-report verb like *ask*.
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Direct speech: He asked, "Where **did** Salman **go** yesterday?"

Indirect speech: He asked where Salman **had gone** the day before / the previous day.

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1. Use a question-report verb like *ask*.
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3. Use statement word order.
4. Use *if* or *whether* to report yes/no questions.

Direct speech: "Do you like coffee?" she asked.

Indirect speech: She asked if I liked coffee.

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Direct speech: He asked her, "Why is the baby crying?"

Indirect speech: He asked her why the baby was crying.

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Direct speech: "Does this hotel have a swimming pool?" the guests inquired.

Indirect speech: The guests inquired whether the hotel had a swimming pool.

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Direct speech: "Who has eaten all the cookies?" asked Rick's mother.

Indirect speech: Rick's mother asked who had eaten all the cookies.

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Direct speech: "Are they leaving tomorrow morning?" Shivani asked.

Indirect speech: Shivani asked if they were leaving the next morning / the following morning.

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4. Use *if* or *whether* to report yes/no questions.

Direct speech: He asked, "How long should I boil an egg?"

Indirect speech: He asked how long he should boil an egg.

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Direct speech: Colton asked me, "Have you received the package?"

Indirect speech: Colton wanted to know if I had received the package.

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4. Use *if* or *whether* to report yes/no questions.

Direct speech: "When **will** your sister get here?" she asked her husband.

Indirect speech: She asked her husband when his sister **would** get there.

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4. Use *if* or *whether* to report yes/no questions.

Direct speech: "Why didn't you attend the meeting?" my boss questioned.

Indirect speech: My boss questioned why I hadn't attended the meeting.

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1. Use a question-report verb like *ask*.

4. Use *if* or *whether* to report yes/no questions.

Direct speech: "Didn't Nicole tell you we were coming today?" he asked.

Indirect speech: He asked whether Nicole hadn't told us that they were coming that day.

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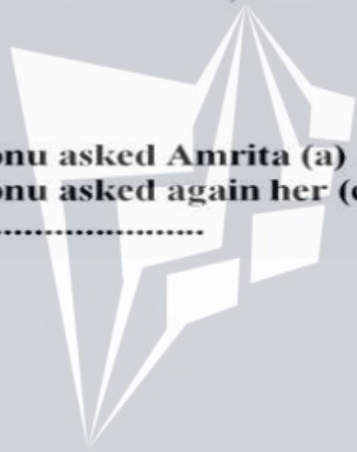

Asha: “Did you attend the science exhibition yesterday?”

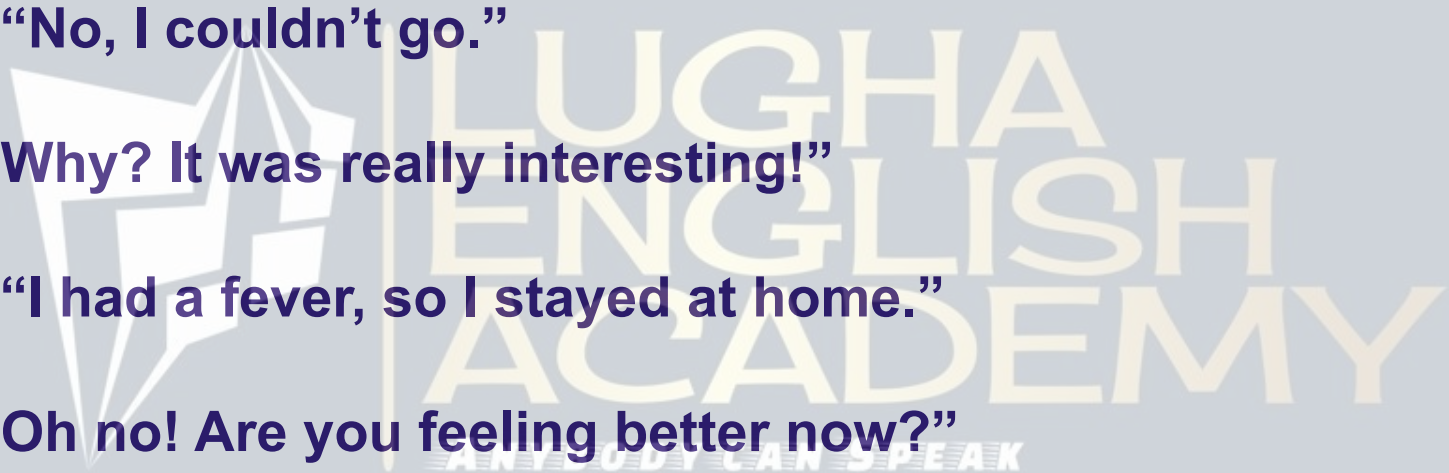

Note: simple present (sub+v1+obj) to past simple (sub+v2+obj)
