When nouns end with **sh**, **ch**, **s** or **x** we add **es** to make plurals.

ii) But there are some nouns that end with a hissing sound, such noun needs 'es' at the end.

iii) Some nouns have 'o' at the end.
Here also we add 'es' at the end.

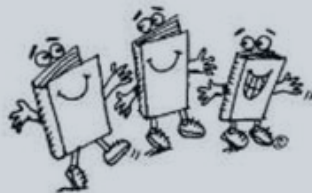

When nouns end with **y** we add **ies** to make plurals.

If there is a vowel before the **y** then **s** is added.

vi) Nouns end with a consonant and 'y'. In such cases drop 'y' and add 'ies' at the end.

lady	ladies
baby	babies
story	stories
family	families
country	countries
diary	diaries
reply	replies

vii) Nouns ends with vowel and 'y', we add 's' to form plurals.

Singular	Plural
donkey	donkeys
valley	valleys
boy	boys
toy	toys
ray	rays
tray	trays

v) There are some nouns that ends with 'f' or 'fe', We cannot add 's' or 'es'. In such nouns, first we turn 'f' into 'v' and then add 'es'.

Singular	Plural
leaf	leaves
wolf	wolves
calf	calves
loaf	loaves
knife	knives
life	lives

Plural rules

most time we just add 's'

ends in 'y' -> drop the 'y' and add 'ies'

ends in 'ch', 's', 'sh', 'x', 'z' -> add 'es'

ends in f or fe -> drop the 'f' 'fe' and add 'ves'

i) We can form plurals by adding 's' to the singular most of the nouns

iv) Some nouns that end with 'o' form their plurals by adding 's' alone.

Singular	Plural
piano	pianos
bamboo	bamboos
stereo	stereos
dynamo	dynamos

viii) There are some nouns that do not follow any rule. These are irregular plurals.

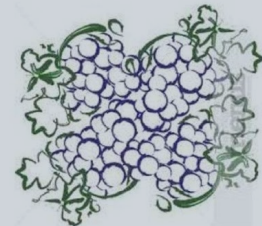

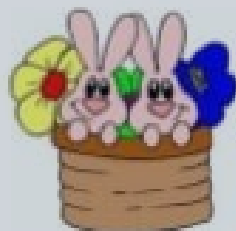
